Our school goal for 2024 is to improve student achievement in Reading and to improve our student attendance data.

Reports

Reports were distributed to students on Tuesday of the last week of this term. If your child hasn't received their Semester One report please check in at Reception to collect your child's report. The key purpose of reporting is to support student learning by providing information to students and parents about achievement and progress and to indicate areas for further development. Your child's report provides clear information on your child's progress and achievement in English, Mathematics and all other areas of learning taught and assessed that semester.

The Australian Curriculum provides teachers and parents with an understanding of what students need to learn at each year level in the form of Achievement standards. A–E grades show learning against your child's current year level standard and their demonstration of attainment.

The A-E grades are displayed on the student report:

Not all students meet the standards expected for their year level. It is common that students may make better progress in some areas than in others. It may also be that while your child is not achieving at the expected level for their age, they may have made significant progress in their learning during that semester. Please contact your child's class teacher for further information regarding student reports and your child's progress. Transition students receive a report containing a written comment and effort rating but no A-E grades.

The canteen will be open from 750am-805am every day for placing recess/lunch orders or purchasing over the counter items.

Canteen news: from term 3 parents/ carers can order food for before school which will be available at 750am. Simply order through Quickcliq online and indicate items for 'breakfast' in the notes.



YOUNG TERRITORY AUTHOR AWARDS



The Young Territory Author Awards (YTAA) are an annual writing competition where entrants write and produce their own book. The Awards aim to inspire children and young people in the NT to explore their ideas and turn them into stories. The competition is open to all Territorians 18 years and under, and is organised in association with other public libraries and schools throughout the Northern Territory. Entries close 27 August 2024 and the winners will be announced in November 2024.

There are lots of prizes to be won:

The Young Territory Author of the year receives \$500.

The School Entry winner receives \$500 for the school.

The Children's Book Council of Australia N.T. WOW award, winner will receive \$200.

Regional area winners receive a \$50 prize.

Age Category winners receive \$50 voucher to the Bookshop Darwin.

Highly Commended in each age category receive a \$30 voucher to the Bookshop Darwin.

Encouragement Awards in each age category receive a \$20 voucher to the Bookshop Darwin.

Entries are considered in all categories they are eligible for. The categories include:

- 1. 8 years and under all single entries in this age bracket are eligible
- 2. 9-12 years all single entries in this age bracket are eligible
- 3. 13-15 years all single entries in this age bracket are eligible
- 4. 16-18 years all single entries in this age bracket are eligible
- 5. Regional areas all entries received (school and single) in an NT region are eligible
- 6. School Entries all entries received from schools are eligible
- 7. CBCA of Australia N.T. WOW award all single entries are eligible

8. Young Territory Author of the year - all single entries are eligible 9.
