This year the School Survey will be running from **Tuesday 6th August – Friday 23 August**. The link to the survey will be sent home via email and on our school Facebook page.

The survey results are used to inform school improvement planning, such as establishing a basis for setting targets, measuring progress, and evaluating school's improvement efforts. Every year we closely examine the survey data at staff meetings <u>and</u> with the Learning Commission students in Years 4, 5 and 6. Our leadership team, our staff and our Learning Commission students will use this data to consider our school strategic direction. Every year the data is tabled at School Council meeting and a summary of the survey results is included in our school newsletter. Your voices are important and we need to hear from you!!!!

Our new eating time routine is now in its second week. At this stage, there has been a lot of positive feedback from teachers saying that students are eating more with less food going to waste.

#### Performing Arts - The 2024 Beat Festival





Week two students worked in small groups to weigh, measure, grate, mix and bake the most delicious Chocolate Zucchini Muffins.






























