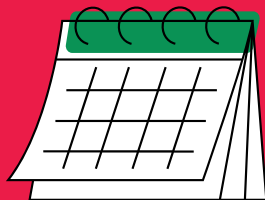

Gold - High Jump

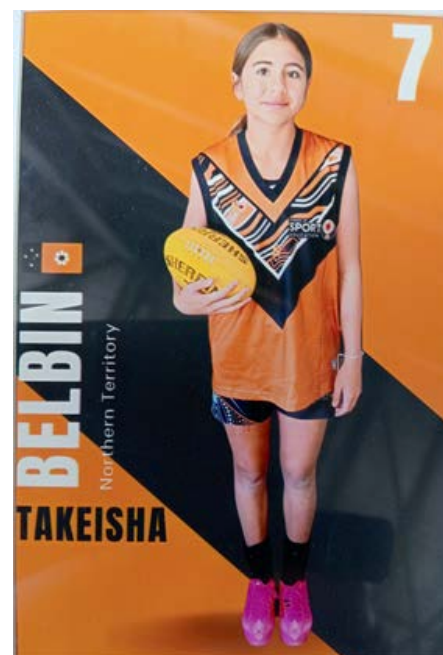
Gold - Shotput (3rd year in a row).

Thank you to Tennis Palmerston for teaching tennis skills in week nine. Years 3 to 6 experienced the tennis workshops.

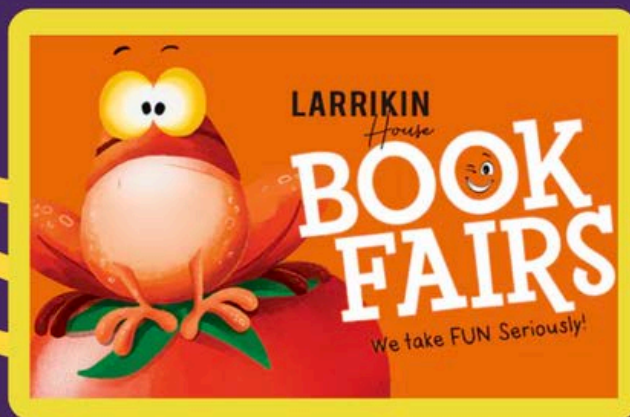

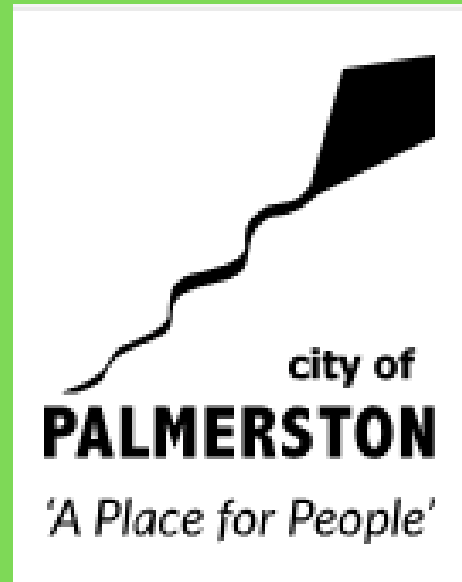
