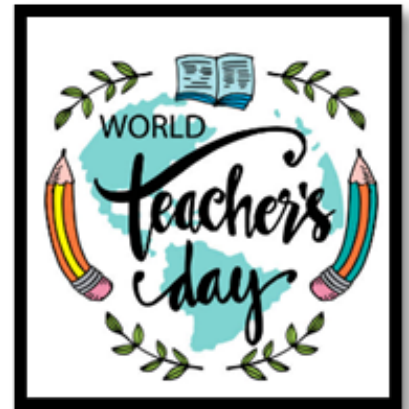
A note from the Principal

Planning for 2025

It is very important that **every family** informs us whether their child/ren will remain at Rosebery Primary School in 2025. This information ensures we can create the right number of classes with the right number of students and not make any changes once the school year begins.

Creating classes for 2025

Once we have accurate data around the number of students we are expecting at Rosebery Primary School in 2025, we can begin to create class groups. We start with the big picture establishing how many classes we need to accommodate the number of students in each year level. We consider the students learning needs and their social/ emotional needs when we develop the overall structure. At this stage, we are planning for 4 x Year 1/2 classes, 4 x Year 3/4 and 4 x Year 5/6 classes and planning for two Transition classes in P5. All teachers will be working in collaborative planning teams. We have been taking Preschool enrolments and are planning for two Preschool groups at this stage.

Once we have finalised the class structures, teachers will begin the task of creating class groups. Teachers will take into consideration student learning needs and friendship groups when placing children in classes. In 2025, students in Years 1-6 teachers will check both class groups when monitoring friendships and will plan for each child having a buddy in their class. At Rosebery Primary School, we have a strong focus on Kagan Cooperative Learning and all teachers invest considerable time is explicitly teaching social skills, teamwork and collaboration. We will plan for smooth transitions to the next year throughout this term. Supporting children moving across the years of their schooling is a priority for teachers.

We ask that any parents/ carers who have concerns about their child's learning or social/emotional wellbeing and its impact on the 2025 class structures to share their concerns with their child's class teacher. **Parents/carers who have specific requests for 2025 related to their child's learning/wellbeing are asked to discuss the requests with Natasha Nichols (Assistant Principal) before Wednesday 15 November.** Once we create our class groupings it becomes very complex to make changes so having all information early allows us to make the best decisions for your child.

URGENT REMINDER: Absolutely NO parking on the children's crossing. If the kiss and go/pick up lane is full, drive around the carpark and try again.

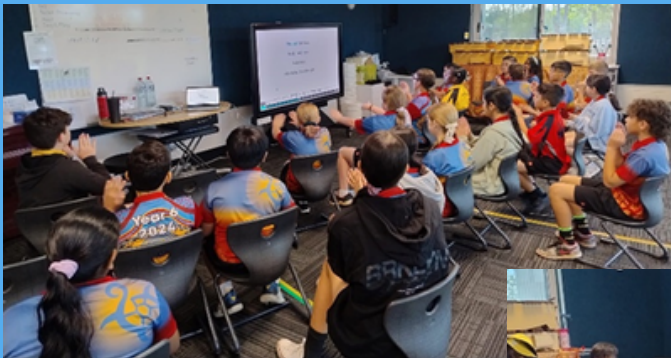
Class Spotlight - Performing Arts - Ms Wulf

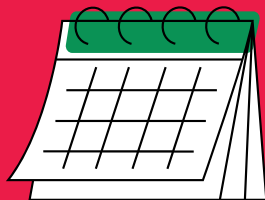
