### Uniform expectation reminder

At Rosebery Primary School, students are expected to wear the full school uniform every day. The uniform consists of: the prescribed polo shirt with prescribed shorts or skorts (with the school logo), the school prescribed bucket hat (with school logo), and closed-in shoes. Black leggings/skins may be worn under the school shorts or skorts but not without the shorts or skorts over the top. In the event of a student arriving to school, not in full uniform, the teacher or staff member, will ask the student to get a 'loan' shirt or shorts. Students without the official school hat are asked to play undercover during recess and lunch. Student need the official school hat to participate in PE if lessons are on the oval. For safety reasons, students without appropriate footwear are unable to participate in PE or access play equipment during recess and lunch. The office is open for uniform sales throughout the year. We also now have a school jacket available for only \$42.

I am pleased to observe that Rosebery students show respect and pride in our school through the way they are being consistent and careful with their dress. A thank you to students, parents and carers for supporting the school and maintaining high standards at all times.



- -2024 Whole School Production


## Dance Camp
