

Planning for changes to the timing of recess and lunch eating time

Many schools across Australia now give students time to eat their recess and lunch after their play time instead of before play time. The reason so many schools have changed a long-standing system is because there are many benefits for student learning and classroom routines. Eating after play, allows students to rest and relax and cool down after play. Teachers find that eating after play means students are ready to learn rather than needing time to cool down after play. Rosebery teachers have been talking about changing eating time to after play time. To finalise the decision, it will be tabled at the next school council meeting at 5:30pm on 29 May. All parents are welcome at council meetings as a visitor and to share your opinions on agenda topics. If you would like to give the school some feedback on the proposal to change eating time from before play to after play, you are invited to respond via email or in person prior to the council meeting or attend the meeting in person.

Gates and student safety

To ensure our students are safe on school grounds at all times we have slightly amended our gate procedures. Aside from front pool gate, all school gates will be kept locked and only opened between:

- 7:30am-8:30am (except assembly days)
- 2:00pm-3:00pm

A friendly reminder, the school is unsupervised before 7:50am and after 2:40pm on school days and so children are asked not to play on school grounds outside of these times. We request that families who need to leave their child at school before 7:50am will access the Outside School Hours program. Parents and carers can enrol through this link: MCA NT.

Getting ready for Sports Day

To participate in PE throughout this term and to participate on Sports Day, all students must wear the official school bucket hat with the Rosebery Primary School logo. The official school hat is available for purchase at the office.




Musica Viva 2024

Our water feature




Have you seen how much our garden has grown around our water feature?
