Our school goal for 2024

Our school goal for 2024 is to improve student achievement in Reading and to improve our student attendance data.

The importance of reading!

Why is our goal for 2024 to improve Reading? Reading is essential to all learning areas. Encouraging your child to love books and enjoy reading is an important way parents can help their child be the best learner they can be. Parents are encouraged to support reading EVERYDAY. For younger students, reading together with parents or older family members is a wonderful shared experience and certainly builds literacy skills. Encourage older children to read independently and broaden their reading experiences. Reading is an essential skill for 21st century learners. Students at Rosebery have access to take home readers and library books. To keep our school books in good condition we encourage the use of the Rosebery library folder or a library bag.

ABC Reading Eggs

The Reading Eggs subscription is part of the 2024 Curriculum Pack for students in Years 1-6. Contact your child's teacher if you do not have your child's user name and log in details for Reading Eggs. ABC Reading Eggs can be accessed on computers, laptops, iPad, iPhone and Android devices with an internet connection. There are two programs within ABC Reading Eggs – ABC Reading Eggs for 3-7 year olds and ABC Reading Eggspress for 7-13 year olds.

A note from the principal continued...

Do I need to sit with my child for every lesson of Reading Eggs? You only need to be there for the first lesson, to make sure that your child knows their way around and understands what to do. After that, it's entirely optional, but it can be fun to watch if you have the time.

What about writing? ABC Reading Eggs Activity Books are another great ABC Reading Eggs resource. These books include a matching writing lesson for every reading lesson. These full colour activity books are an excellent way to reinforce and extend what children are learning online. The link between reading and writing is a strong one. Research shows that the act of writing is an excellent way to reinforce reading and phonic skills.

Planning for changes to the timing of recess and lunch eating time

Last week the Rosebery Primary School Council voted in favour of a one term trial for eating time to be after the play time. Teachers and administration are still discussing the impact of implementation such as timetable changes, fruit breaks, time for eating and canteen over the counter sales. We will need to make changes in all of these areas. Once teachers have finalised decisions and a trial process is identified we will share with parents and carers via email and in the last newsletter of term 2. Parent voice is always welcome so please email or pop in if you have ideas that you would like to be considered in the new eating time processes.




